West Bengal Khadi and Village Industries Board (WBKVIB) has developed a Folk Art Centre and Community Museum at Bikna. One can plan a day trip to Bikna for a sneak peek into the lives of the artists and experience the craft making process. Guest can also enjoy Panchmura, the terracotta village which is 1 hour drive from Bikna, Both Bikna Dokra and Panchmura Terracotta have received Geographical Indication (GI) accreditation.

These are all day trips, thus one can stay on their own and visit these villages during day time. However, simple stay arrangement exists at both Bikna and Panchmura and you can contact artists directly for the same.
